## THE EXAMINATION SYSTEM

Examination Procedures: CBCS pattern of Examination System is followed and the total credits turn out to be 140 for all the UG degree courses, 90 for all the PG degree courses and 24 for all MPhil degree courses. Evaluation of Students performance in examinations is done in two phases, namely **Continuous Internal Assessment** (CIA) and Semester Examinations (SE). The performance of a student in each course is evaluated in terms of grade points and also provided with the equal percentage of marks. The End Semester Examination is of Written-type and the Practical examinations also form an integral component of the evaluation.

Continuous Internal Assessment System: Continuous Internal Assessment Tests are conducted twice a semester. The first test is conducted in the middle of the semester. The second test is conducted towards the end of the semester.

#### The components of CIA are as below (Practical):

**Pass Requirements**: For UG degree courses, the passing minimum is 10 out of 25 in CIA and 30 out of 75 in Semester Examinations (40%). For PG degree courses, the passing minimum of marks is 10 out of 25 in CIA and 30 out of 75 in Semester Examinations but making an aggregate of 50% marks as minimum mark.

**Transparency/ Revaluation / Retotalling:** Application for Transparency shall be made within 7 days after the publication of results. Revaluation / Retotalling of the answer script is also permitted and shall be made within 10 days from the date of publication of results.

**Arrear Examinations:** Arrear examinations for the alternative semesters will be conducted before the commencement of regular semester examinations.

The students who have arrears in the current semester are allowed to write the arrear papers along with the regular examinations. This practice enables the students to concentrate on doing well in the regular semester papers.

**Supplementary Examination:** This Examination will be conducted after a month from the publication of results to the final year UG and PG students who have failed exactly in one paper in the present or previous semesters.

**Student Portal**: The course wise student's attendance is entered daily in student portal and the consolidated percentage of attendance report is taken before the end semester examinations. Students can view their profile, hall ticket, timetable, CIA and result through the student portal.

**Students feedback** is also available in the portal. Every student has to give her feedback through the portal at the college website <u>www.adjadmc.ac.in</u>. before the end semester examinations.

**Malpractice** is severely viewed by the Discipline Committee formed with the Principal, Controller of Examinations, the HOD & staff incharge and the student concerned. Severe warning and action will be taken against the type of issue caused.

**Attendance:** Each semester has 90 working days in the case of both Aided and Self Financing stream. Students must have 75% of attendance in each semester to appear for the examination. Students who have attendance between 60% and 74% shall apply for condonation in the prescribed form with the prescribed fee. Students who have attendance below 60% are not eligible to appear for the examination. They shall re-do the semester(s) after completion of the programme.

## **GENERAL RULES**

- 1. Students should greet the principal and other superior and members of the faculty when they meet them for the first time during the day.
- 2. When attending a class, a meeting of college associations or other gathering, students are expected to be attentive and silent.

- 4. Students should wear clean and decent clothes and confirm to the rules of modesty.
- 5. The cleanliness in the college building and surrounding should be the personal responsibility of every student. Therefore no marks should be made on the walls or desk. No paper should be thrown on the floor.
- 6. No private collection of fund can be made without the approval of the college authorities.
- 7. On becoming members of the college, students are obliged to obey its rules and regulations and uphold its discipline.
- 8. Parents, guardians, relatives or friends will not be granted permission to visit the students during the college hours.
- 9. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority the Student concerned shall be given liberty to explain and if her explanation is not found satisfactory, the College authority is empowered to expel her from the College.

### Fee Regulation:

- 1. An academic year has of two semesters
- 2. June to November Odd Semester & December to April Even Semester
- 3. The fee shall be paid within 10 days from the date of reopening of each semester.
- 4. The semester fee shall be paid by every new student before she is enrolled. Student will neither be allowed to sit for the examination nor their certificates be issued until all their dues are cleared.

5. Students must pay the semester fees due even if she discontinued in the middle of the semester, if a student leaves the college in the middle, she does not have the right to claim remission of any portion of the fee.

If semester fee is not paid within ten days after the prescribed date, the student's name will be 'struck of the rolls'.

- 6. Students must take responsibility of informing the parents about the last date for the payment of fees.
- A Recognition Fee of Rs.250/- in addition to the university Registration fee will be collected from each student who are from other than the Bharathidasan University.

#### Attendance Rules:

- 1. Regular attendance for classes compulsory.
- 2. In case of absence due to unexpected reasons, a leave letter should be submitted prior to the date of leave or on the first day of her arrival of the college after the leave.
- 3. Application for leave should be submitted to the principal/HOD in proper format stating clearly the reason for absence, name, class and roll number of the absentee. It must be countersigned by the parent or the Hostel Warden.
- 4. A Student who absents without leave letter for any hour of the day will be regarded as absent for the whole day.
- 5. Students must present for the morning assembly. A Student entering the college after the assembly will present herself to the respective Department for getting permission to attend the class. The Department will keep a record of late comers.
- 6. The annual certificate of attendance required for the Semester Examination will in no case be granted unless:
  - (a) The Principal is satisfied with the students progress and conduct
  - (b) The **student** put in 75% of the attendance.

### **Certificates:**

- 1. Certificate will generally be issued in less than 24 hours' notice.
- 2. Students who wish to obtain a certificate (Transfer, Age, Conduct, No due etc.,) shall apply for it in the prescribed form available in the college office.
